Who can vote?

Motion in regards to Motion Voting

Usually general business voting is by show of hands, unless secret ballot is requested.

This year we will use a virtual show of hands, or if there is not a clear majority through that method, we will vote through the Zoom polling tool, which displays instant results to all attendees.

Zoom will also record in the background who voted which way, but that information will only be reviewed if the voting is close, to ensure only valid votes are counted.

The information will then be immediately destroyed.



Scrutineer Process for Online Voting

Lindsay Summers (Member but non-Executive) will be serving as scrutineer during the voting.

Lindsay will be provided real-time access to both the poll and responses, and she will compare the responses to the registrations for the meeting to validate the responses, if necessary.

This will be done on a separate screen share to keep the information private, but Lindsay will verbally confirm the results of the review.

Bylaws Voting – Special Resolution

- (q) "special resolution" means:
- a resolution passed at a general meeting of the Association by a majority of not less than 75% of the votes cast by those members entitled to vote at such meeting; or
- (ii) a resolution consented to in writing by every member who would have been entitled to vote in person at a general meeting of the Association;

Bylaws Voting

BC Gaming does not agree with this verbiage:

6.10 A person may stand for election as a director if, in addition to meeting the qualifications as set out in the Societies Act, the person meets the following qualifications:

- (a) the person is and will remain an Active Member during the term of office for which he or she is nominated; and
- (b) in the case of the office of President; Vice-President of Administration; Vice-President of U6 to U11; or Vice-President of U13 to U21, the person has served on the Executive in at least one of the two terms immediately before the term of office for which he or she is nominated.

Bylaws Voting

Proposed Change:

6.10 A person may stand for election as a director if, in addition to meeting the qualifications as set out in the Societies Act, the person meets the following qualifications:

(a) the person is and will remain an Active Member during the term of office for which he or she is nominated. ; and

(b) in the case of the office of President; Vice-President of Administration; Vice-President of U6 to U11; or Vice-President of U13 to U21, the person has served on the Executive in at least one of the two terms immediately before the term of office for which he or she is nominated.

Life Member Voting

Both approved – both votes 100% in favour



General:

- Add verbiage of having served on Executive prior to being nominated for VP or President that was previously in the Bylaws.
- Enforcement of Dressing Room monitoring and addition of spot checking procedures.
- Graduating players at U18 will be allowed 'buddy' requests.
- Requirement to sign waiver during registration re NSL policy.



Discipline:

- Discipline Meetings will be held with Director of Hockey instead of full Discipline Committee, except in situations of escalation.
- Maltreatment situations within a team 7 days from all activities.
- Maltreatment 'return' plan will be created to assist teams to support victims and create a positive and progressive outcome.



A Tryouts:

- Junior B returns adjust U18 team camp numbers to allow for returns.
- Exemptions at U18 for tryouts \$50 fee and one skate.



Development:

- Increase of Goalie and Player development for A teams with parent coaches to 8 team sessions per season.
- A teams with independent coaches remain at 5 team sessions.
- C teams remain at 18+ sessions per season except U18.
- U18 remains with Cloverdale Cup and option of 5 team sessions.



Volunteer Program Update

- Requirement of 8 credit hours per player, for up to 2 players.
- Elimination of 'Part Time' Positions.
- All Positions have expectation of 16 + hours time commitment.
- Not completed fee pre-authorized and charged automatically at end of season – no cheques to be collected.
- Opt Out increased to \$300
- QR Code check-ins will still be required.
- Each Tournament will have a Volunteer Coordinator.
